In the beginning...

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE JCI SENATE

The grain of an idea for the JCI Senate program was begun in 1951 when JCI President Phil Pugsley and John Armbruster were talking about "The Log", a publication that Mr. Armbruster was sending out to past officers and directors of the U.S. Junior Chamber of Commerce (a.k.a. Jaycees). "The Log" had played an important role in sustaining friendships that had been formed through the Jaycees. President Pugsley was interested in a similar publication for the alumni of the Junior Chamber International and asked that Mr. Armbruster be the publisher.

"The Elder Statesman" was sent to JCI alumni throughout the world and served as a continuing conduit of friendship to former members. Many of these elder statesmen were becoming mentors to younger JCI members and also serving in a large role as leaders in their respective countries.

However, many past members were getting less involved with the Jaycee movement as there were no ties to the organization. In New York, in 1952, JCI Representative to the United Nations, Sid Boxer, met with Phil Pugsley, where they discussed what could bring former members back to the fold. One idea was a special "honor" that could be presented to former members. Many local chapters were honoring their past members with

gifts. Why couldn't that same money be spent through Junior Chamber International and be put to work for a cause that the former and current members all believed in?

Boxer and Pugsley came up with the idea of a group of "honored" members that, once formed, could be used to help spread the concept of the Junior Chamber and its mission throughout the world. Membership in this group would also help strengthen Junior Chamber International by giving its former members a lifelong tie to the organization.

The "JCI Senate" idea was voted on at the 7th JCI World Congress in Melbourne, Australia in September 1952 and included in the JCI Bylaws as a category of membership. Since then, Junior Chamber members in over 90 countries have been honored.

Today, a Senatorship has become a coveted honor that recognizes outstanding contribution and service to JCI and its member organizations. By providing Life membership, there is a link with an organization that continues to bring the Junior Chamber vision to thousands of young adults the world over. Fees paid for a Senatorship are used to provide for the continuing growth and opportunity of JCI to more and more young people.

The United States JCI Senate was formed, and its Constitution and Bylaws adopted, in Atlanta, Georgia on June 20, 1972.

The Michigan JCI Senate:

The JCI Senate was formed during the 1952 JCI World Congress in Australia: Canada's Phil Pugsley was the first JCI Senate President.

It took 20 additional years for the US JCI Senate to form, which it did at the 1972 National Jaycee Convention held in Atlanta. Jim O'Connell, Illinois, was elected our first USJCI Senate President.

History shows that the Michigan JCI first began its existence in the 1960's and it was Raymond "Doc" Huldin's dedication and perseverance that we survive and grew and we are extremely grateful to him. On December 11, 1969, a special observance banquet was held in Lansing to celebrate the 25th anniversary of JCI. Special guest and honored speaker was Raymond A. Wolfe who organized the first JCI meeting in Mexico City on December 11, 1944. It was at this historical meeting that Junior Chamber International was founded. Brother Wolfe was a member of the Grand Haven (MI) chapter and at the banquet was presented with Senatorship #10500 by the Grand Haven Jaycees.

The Michigan J.C.I. Senate, as we know it today, was officially launched on September 9, 1972, at the home of

Chuck Nicholas in Eaton Rapids. Several Michigan Senators including Ray Huldin, Roger Lyons, Jim Willoughby, Dave Blakely and Chuck Nicholas were in attendance. Guests included US JCI President Jim O'Connell, Rep. Senators JCI Bob Drdak and Chic Lantz. O'Connell informed the Michigan Senate of the newly formed national organization and requested Michigan's support. Ideas and programs for both the national and state groups were discussed and adopted. We were now on our way, firmly established.

The Michigan Senate annual meeting was held in February during the Michigan Jaycee Winter Board meeting and Raymond "Doc" Huldin was elected as the 1st period of the reorganized Senate. The new By-laws and

Constitution were rewritten and adopted September 19, 1974. On October 2, 1974, we officially became affiliated with the United States Jaycee Senate.

Michigan JCI Senate Events

The Michigan JCI Senate over its 40 years have developed a wide range events for members to participate in covering the range of fundraisers to social programs. Many events involved hospitality at all gatherings, as well as golfing, euchre and family picnics. But a few others are worth highlighting.

Border Bash

(Michigan Senate vs Ohio and later Indiana) It is uncertain when the "first" Border Bash between Michigan and Ohio took place, but after a few years with no meeting this annual event was revised in 1989, under Bob Boufford #31174.



The odd years were held in Michigan and even years in Ohio. Senators spent a day together in fellowship with a friendly



competition between state Presidents for bragging rights. In more recent years the Indiana JCI Senators expressed an interest in participating and now this event making it an annual tri-state fiesta.



Renaissance Festival

Originally, the Michigan JCI Senate helped the Holly Jaycees manage the beer and wine tents one weekend per year 1987-88. In 1989 the Senate ran their first Renaissance

we made over \$5,000 that first weekend.
Denny passed the chairmanship of this annual
event between 2006-2007 to Mary Burden
#62527 and Dave Dunville #66300. This
project continues to be the major fundraiser
for our organization. The average revenue for
a weekend with great weather is between
\$11,000 to \$14,000. A rainy weekend may see
those numbers drop

to between \$6500 to \$9000. It takes over 700 man hours in two days, staffed by Senators, families, friends and co-workers to pull this event off. Recent estimates are we serve over 12,000 people each day with enough beer and wine to fill about 1/2 of an Olympic size pool.



Woodward Dream Cruise

Selling t-shirts and merchandise Friday and Saturday at the Phoenix Center as a fundraiser for the MI JCI Senate started in

2003 with the leadership of Pat Malac #41085 and Joe Hildebrand #44714. Originally, the Senate had a booth and received part of profits for providing manpower. In 2011, now under the chairmanship of Pat and Tim LaBarge #43200, the MI JCI



Senate is now responsible for purchasing and selling their own merchandise. This event has become a favorite as a way to socialize with each other and see some really cool classic cars.





Post-Holiday Party

This annual event is held the first weekend in January. It is believed that the very first one was held in 1983 in Waterford and chaired by Ruth and Larry Davis, #30874. Later years, this event was moved to Southgate (originally at Dom Polski Hall and later at



the Southgate Ice Rink Hall) and organized by Ellen and Dennis, #38041 Kester. Recently, the evening of great food, wonderful music and the "famous" white elephant gift auction is organized by Rich Lindow, #40108 and Julie Carter, #51324 and held at the Crystal Garden, still in Southgate.

Golf Outings


The MI JCI Senate is well-known for their golf outings, despite all the other programs and social activities they hold



throughout the year. Our biggest tournament is still going strong today. After battling leukemia, Hal Krekorian #9695 passed away onAugust 20, 1993. In 1995 the MI JCI Senate established is the Hal Krekorian Memorial Golf Tournament in his memory. The tourna-

ment is

held each year, in June, in conjunction with the USJCI Senate Annual Meeting, with the purpose of raising funds for the US JCI Senate Foundation. In the nearly twenty years since its inception the golf outing has raised approximately \$150,000 for the Foundation. The mission of the Foundation is to award





The MI JCI Senate has often run an Annual Golf Outing at the end of August. The first year Michigan ran this event is unknown and recent years this event has been sporadic. However, it is a favorite especially the steak dinner that usually comes after 18 holes of

golf. Side story: Michelle Arman #42077 would often "bless the balls." And another Senator (who shall remain nameless) was reported to have "fallen off the ball washer." For more details, seek a Senator whose number is less than #30000.

"Peter The Great"

Starting in 1975-76, this was a fundraiser to raise money for the beer supplied in the hospitality room. "Peter the Great" was a Jaycee who had passed on. Senators encourage unsuspecting Jaycees to come inside to pay their respect and contribute a small donation to continue the "spirit" of Peter (aka - beer). Several wives of the Senators would be seated up front - crying and distraught over his passing. Senators took turns giving his eulogy which contained many double entendres (he provided a lot of "service" to the Jaycee Auxiliary). This would go on until a group of women walked by to pay their respect to "Peter" at which point a lever was pulled and Peter's "greatness" would pop up (if you know what I mean). This continued through to

1977 where they had the final burial of Peter the Great. In 1987 at the fall board meeting, Peter made a return. Much of this was thanks to Charles Kobert, #9295.



Filibuster

The main newsletter of the MI JCI Senate has been and remains the Filibuster. In the early years, Bill Dietz #11076 served as publisher and printer the



Filibuster (either at cost or for free) - and some times well after deadline. Once a monthly publication, it became a bimonthly communication in 2005. Shortly after that, printed copies were only mailed to those members who requested it, while most members choose to receive their's electronically by email. Past copies of the Filibuster can be found on the MI JCI Senate's website going back to 2004.

Website

In 2000 John VanWyck #32640 and Mike Fortuna (son of then President Steve Fortuna #41075) undertook the huge project of beginning the official Michigan JCI Website. It grew quickly with many thanks to Paul Ballinger #12277 and has been managed by Sue Foltin #63744 since 2004 (estimate). ENEWS & Facebook

Michigan JCI Senate: Jaycee Impact & Awards

The Michigan JCI Senate enjoys a close relationship with the Michigan Jaycees. The following are some of the programs and or impact that the Senate provides:

Michigan Jaycees Convention Assistance

The MI JCI Senate continues to provide the Michigan Jaycees with assistance at the trimester (once quarterly) meetings by

providing trainers as well as judges for the Individual Development



Area competitions. During the Election meeting, the Senate also provides workers to help register delegates, man the ballot boxes and help count ballots.

First Timers Program

The First Timers program was started in 1976 to give a free registration to the next State Meeting to the new Jaycee who introduced himself to the Mystery Senator at the Friday Night Party. This program later developed into a more formal (brief) meeting covering the history of the Jaycee organization. Each "First Timer" is then provided with a signature booklet and encouraged to meet as many Jaycees as they can, get their signatures and answer questions. Bonus points are awarded for a "mystery guest." The First Timer with the most points is announced at lunch, presented with a certificate of achievement and the Senate continues to pay for their registration at the next convention.

Speakers Bureau

The Speakers Bureau was originally established to provide speakers to local chapters (for low or no cost). It was comprised of Senators listed by category they were comfortable speaking on, the distance they would travel and other information. Local Jaycee chapters could go to the Bureau and find a Senator need them. The original Senate Speakers Bureau was established by John Savage #37071.

Senate Sponsored Senatorship

In 1979 the MI JCI Senate started sponsoring the award of a Senatorship for a deserving Jaycee who seemed to have been

overlooked by his local chapter or perhaps their local chapter lacked the funds by which to honor him (or later her). The MI JCI Senate has given up to one (1) per year, providing the funds are available.



Women and the MI JCI Senate

The 1987-88 saw the first women Senators: Michele Arman (Baskin) #42077 and Betty Cusick #42076.

Return the Favor (Tony K. Memorial Award)

During the 1987-88 year, the US JCI Senate began a program called "Yes We Can Help" which recognized senators who did an outstanding job assisting Jaycees. The following year it was renamed "Return the Favor" and has been an ongoing award

given at the state and national level ever since. Art Abbott #23795 was the first chairman for this quarterly (now trimester) award in the state of Michigan. In 2007, a few months after his death, this award was named in honor of Tony Karasiewicz #62686, who had been the recipient numerous times.



Senate Doc Huldins / Honorary Life Members

In the MI JCI Senate calendar year of 1980-81, we saw the formal establishment of the "Doc Huldin Award" which became the "Doc Huldin Memorial Award" after his untimely death.

The follwing year, 1981-82, the Board approved Honorary and paid life memberships in the Michigan JCI Senate for the ten immediate Past Presidents and at the year end convention in Kalamazoo, presented those honors. Since 1983, this has become an annual tradition that all JCI Senate Past Presidents are presented with an Honorary Life Membership in the Michigan JCI Senate, to show the organization's appreciation for their service as Presidents.

The Michigan Jaycees have annually presented at their Year-end Award ceremony the "Dr. Raymond E. "Doc" Huldin Memorial Award" to the "Outstanding JCI Senator" of the year. Unfortunately records have not been maintained as to provide a complete list of recipients. However, separate from this award, the MI JCI Senate has seen fit from time to time to provide it's own version of the Doc Huldin Award which includes an honorary life membership. Only a handful of these awards have ever been given out. Again, accurate records have not been maintain, but the best we've been able to come up with include the following, of which some were just *Honorary Life Member* recipients for going "above and beyond" the call of service. Our apologies to anyone missed.

Regional Events

Hal Krekorian Memorial Golf Tournament

In 1985 the US JCI Senate Foundation was formed to give financial assistance to deserving high school seniors to further their education. The Foundation used investment earnings (not direct funds from various golf tournaments) to provide these funds. The first president of the Foundation was our own Doug

Hincker, #22200. In 1995 the MI JCI Senate established the Hal Krekorian Memorial Golf Tournament to be held at the National Convention in honor of the 13th President of the MI JCI Senate (1985-86). In addition to Hal, the MI JCI Senate has made donations honoring other deceased



Past Presidents Doc Huldin, #3658 (president 1973-74) and Tom Humphrey, #12758 (president 1991-92, died 1992).

Mentors

The "Mentors" publication comes from the US JCI Senate and was started in 1978 after a 2-year lapse. By 1983 it was published 4 times a year and was sent to every Senator as a prime communication tool. For many of these years, the MI JCI Senate has passed around an envelope at every meeting (once monthly, now 3-times a year) and asked every Senator to contribute at least \$1 that was sent to the Mentors program. As a result, Michigan has been and continues to be one of the largest contributors to the Mentors publication.


